How data has been used in Mercer County for planning and decision-making

- Contributing Factors

- Higher standards of expectation to end family homelessness (HEARTH Act & Opening Doors Federal Strategic Plan to Prevent and End Homelessness)
- Use of technology to capture data (HMIS)
- Limited Resources (budget cuts, capacity)

“Data = Dollars”



What We Do

1. Use data to drive the system
2. Reviewed performance data related to:
 - Housing stability
 - Length of time of homelessness
 - Cost effectiveness

Rapid Re-housing (RRH), Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing models



System Change: Identified Outcomes of Rapid Re-housing Pilot Project to measure

Rapid Re-housing will decrease the amount of time that families are homeless

Rapid Re-housing will increase housing stability for families who experience homelessness

Rapid Re-housing will be more cost effective than emergency shelter and transitional housing

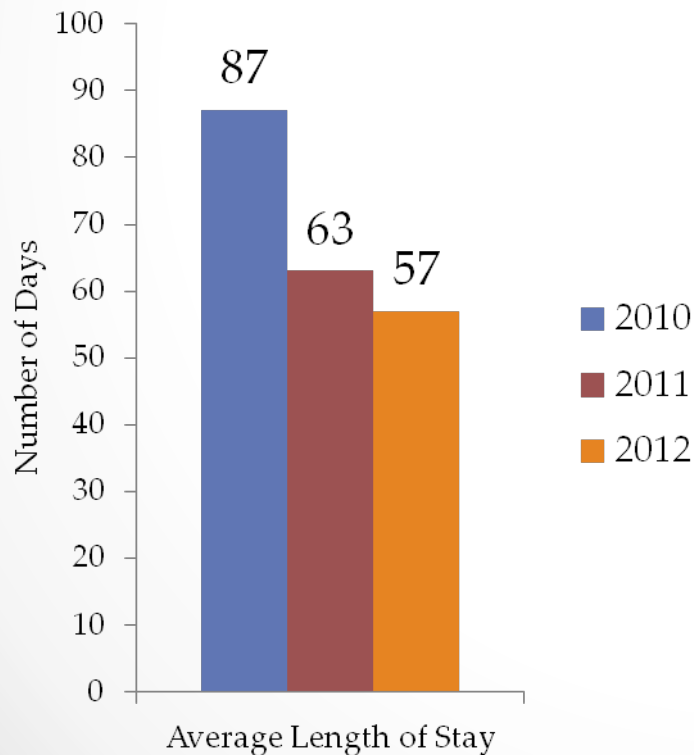

Outcome 1: Rapid Re-housing will reduce the length of time families are homeless

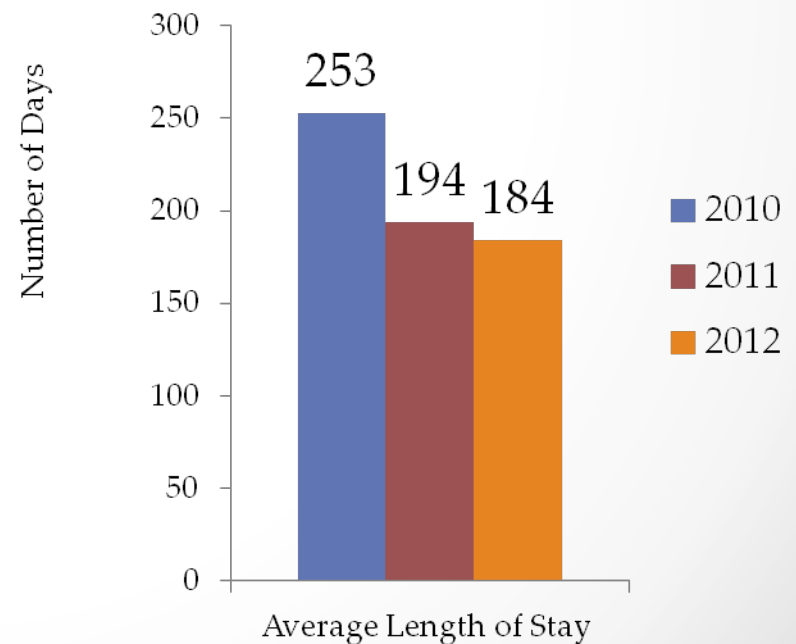
Average Length of Stay in Emergency Shelter

34% decrease in Emergency shelter LOS



Average Length of Stay in Transitional Housing

27% decrease in Transitional Housing LOS

Outcome 2: Rapid Re-housing will increase Housing Stability

Income at Exit

Transitional Housing	Rapid Re-Housing	% Increase
\$558	\$835	50%

49% of families had an Earned Income at time of Exit from Rapid Re-housing

Housing Stability at Exit

Transitional Housing	Rapid Re-Housing
23%	79%

As reported in the 2011 Annual Homeless Assessment Report

Outcome 3: Rapid Re-housing will be more cost effective than emergency shelter and transitional housing

Intervention	Per diem Rate
Shelter (homeless)	\$125.00
Transitional Housing (homeless)	\$84.00
TRA & Wrap around services in Rapid Re-housing	\$ 50.00

What We Do

2.
 - Systems Monitor review, monitor and analyze data
 - Monthly Data Committee meetings held with Site Administrators and Data Entry staff to discuss data quality, APRs, AHAR, and address issues or concerns
 - Monthly meetings with HMIS Lead and Software Vendor

What We Do

3. Use data to develop strategies for changing the homeless delivery system
 - CoC reallocated transitional housing funding to RRH
 - Coordinate and leverage multiple funding sources (ex., CoC, ESG, CDBG, TANF and County funds)
