How can data be used?



Determining Need

(Total number of homeless persons who need program component type)

(Total beds available/under development)

= Total unmet need

Can be modified using additional local data



Prioritizing Unmet Needs

- Look at relative need among sub-populations
- Consider the vulnerability of the population (age, diagnosis)
- Identify groups not yet served versus those with some housing resources in place
- Determine whether the need is growing, and if so, how rapidly
- Look at users of high-end services (e.g. hospitalization, detoxification)



Evaluating the System

- What types of housing/services are needed?
- What groups are being underserved?
- Are performance standards being met?
- Are there poor-performing sectors of system?
