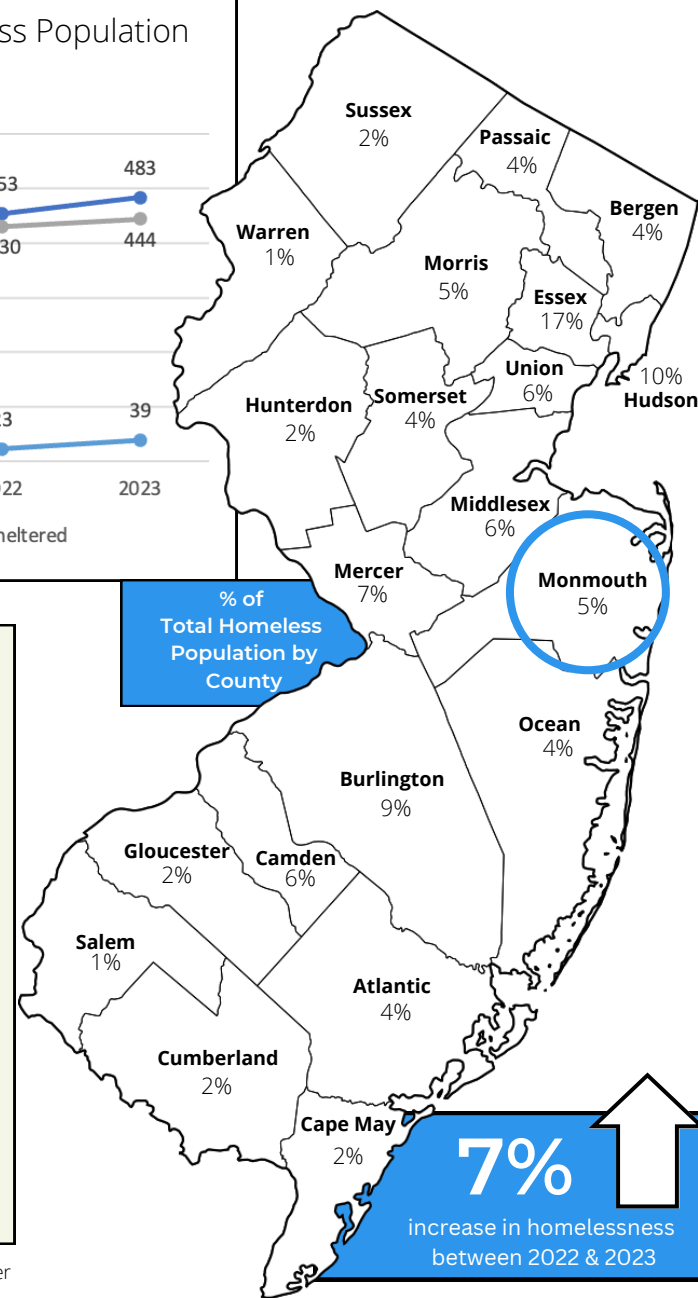
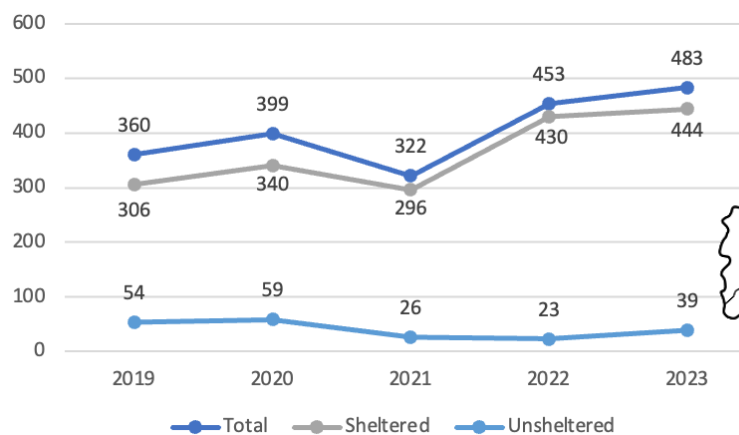

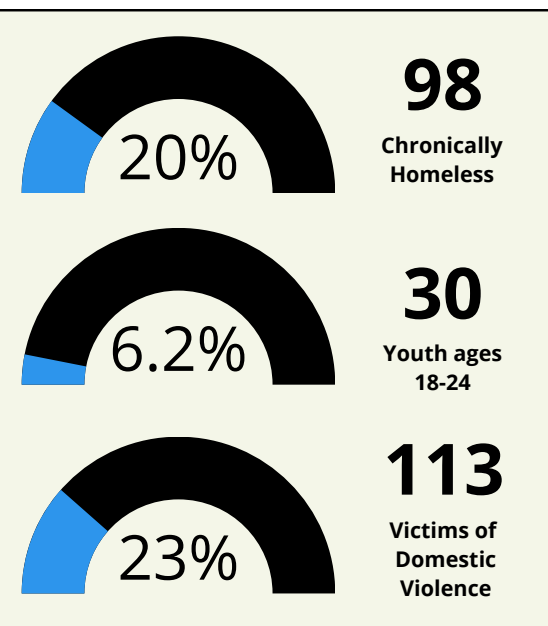

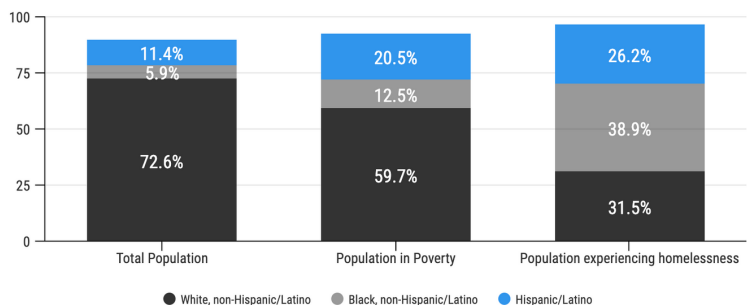

Black, non-Hispanic/Latino are **overrepresented** — 5.9% of the total population, yet account for 38.9% of the population experiencing homelessness.
