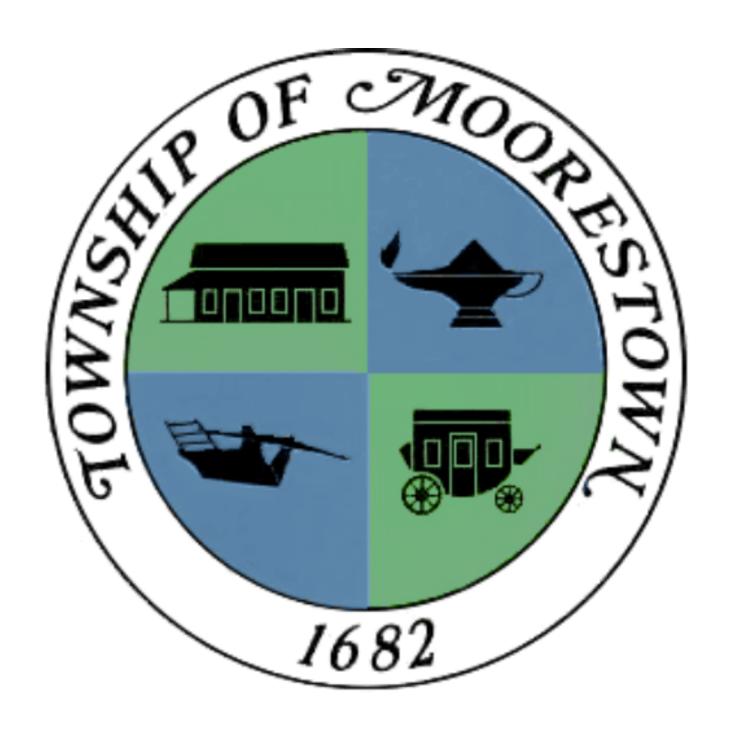

May 2022 Final Judgement of Compliance and Repose:

Round 3 Obligation: 1167 Units

Realistic Development Potential: 633 Units

- 140 Existing units or extensions of expiring controls
- 338 New units to be created
- + 159 Bonus credits (maximum available)
- = 633 Total RDP obligation
 - + Unmet need/overlay zoning for 303 additional units

FHA/AH Timeline and Deadlines

Reporting due to DCA on all

Non-Residential and Residential Development Fees and Expenditures, along with status and details of all affordable housing units.

Deadline for a municipality to adopt their obligation numbers via "Binding Resolution" with or without using the DCA's published report.

Deadline for interested parties to challenge a municipality's adopted obligation numbers.

Deadline for the Affordable Housing Dispute Resolution Program (AHDRP) to settle the municipal obligation number challenge(s).

Deadline for interested parties to challenge the validity of a municipality's **Housing Element** and Fair Share Plan.

Deadline for a municipality to amend its **Housing Element** and Fair Share Plans and to adopt the implementing ordinances to comport with the amended obligation numbers.

September 16, 2024

October 20. 2024

January 31, February 15, February 28, 2025

March 1, 2025

April 1. 2025

June 30. 2025

August 31, 2025

December 31, 2025

March 15. 2026

Deadline for the DCA to complete and publish a report on the calculation of regional needs and municipal obligations for each region. A new report is due August 1 of the year prior to the start of each 10-year round.

Reporting due to DCA on the status of all Non-Residential and Residential **Development Fees** collected and expended from the previous year.

If no challenges, the municipality's obligation numbers are established by default, immunity remains in effect.

Deadline for a municipality to adopt and endorse a Housing Element and Fair Share Plan and file with the Program to maintain immunity.

Deadline for a municipality to settle any challenge or provide an explanation as to why it will not make all or some of the requested changes.
