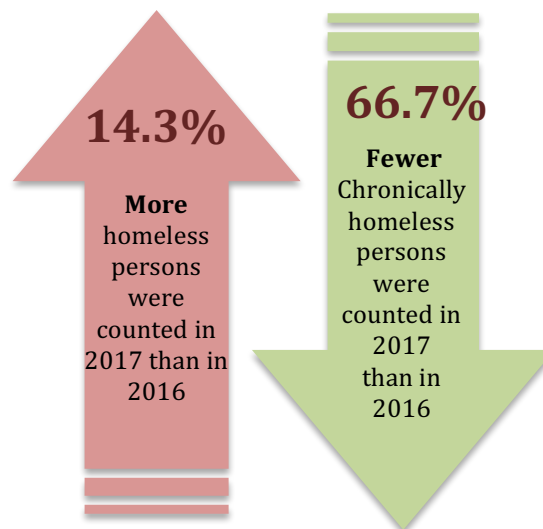


2017 Gloucester County Point-In-Time Count Fact Sheet

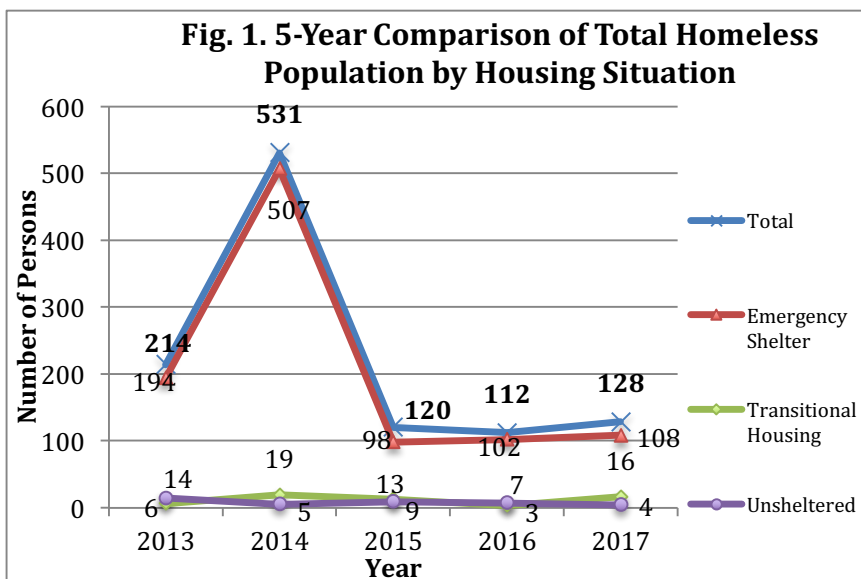
Gloucester County 2017 Overall Results

- 128 men, women and children were homeless in Gloucester County on the night of January 24th, 2017. Gloucester County had 1.5% of New Jersey's statewide homeless population on the night of the count.
- This represents an increase of 16 persons (14.3%) as compared to 2016.
- 3 persons were identified as chronically homeless, representing 2.3% of the total homeless population in the County.
- 4 persons were unsheltered on the night of the count, a 42.9% decrease since 2016.



NJ Counts Key Findings

- There was a 5.9% increase in the emergency shelter population, an increase of 13 persons in transitional housing, and a 42.9% decrease in the unsheltered population.
- 29 of the 63 homeless households (46%) were families with children under the age of 18. There were 57 children under 18 (44.5%) who were homeless on the night of the count. Adult only households accounted for 54% of the homeless households.
- 2 homeless veterans were identified, representing a 50% decrease from 2016.
- Among homeless adults, 43.7% identified a disabling condition. The predominant conditions identified include chronic health conditions and mental health issues.
- 25.4% of homeless households reported no source of income and only one homeless household reported that they did not receive any non-cash benefits.
- 12.7% of the homeless households were homeless for more than one year.
