
2017 Hunterdon County Point-In-Time Count Fact Sheet


Hunterdon County 2017 Overall Results

- 130 men, women and children were homeless on the night of January 24th, 2017, representing 1.5% of New Jersey's total homeless population.
- This represents a decrease of 3 persons (2.3%) as compared to the 2016 count.
- 17 persons were identified as chronically homeless, representing 13.1% of the total homeless population.
- 17 unsheltered persons were identified on the night of the count, an increase from the 2 counted in 2016.



NJ Counts Key Findings

- There was a 24.2% decrease in the emergency shelter population, a decrease of 2 persons from transitional housing, and a 15 person increase in the unsheltered population from the 2016 count.
- 6 of the 119 homeless households (5%) were families with children under the age of 18. There were 9 children under 18 (6.9%) who were homeless on the



night of the count. Adult only households accounted for 95% of the homeless households.

- 77 veterans were identified as homeless, representing an 8.5% increase from 2016.
- Among homeless adults, 86% identified a disabling condition. The predominant conditions identified were substance abuse disorders and mental health issues.
- 27.7% of homeless households reported no source of income and 5.9% of homeless households reported that they did not receive any non-cash benefits.
- 24 homeless households were homeless for more than one year.
