
2017 Passaic County Point-In-Time Count Fact Sheet


Passaic County 2017 Overall Results

- 449 men, women and children were homeless on the night of January 24th, 2017, representing 5.3% of New Jersey's homeless population.
- This represents an increase of 17 persons (3.9%) as compared to the 2016 count.
- 58 persons were identified as chronically homeless, representing 12.9% of the total homeless population.
- 89 persons were unsheltered on the night of the count, an increase of 53 persons from 2016.



NJ Counts Key Findings

- There was a 11.9% decrease in the emergency shelter population, a 32% increase in the transitional housing population, and a 147.2% increase in the unsheltered population.
- 63 of the 306 homeless households (20.6%) were families with children under the age of 18. There were 126 children under 18 (28.1%) who were homeless on the night of the count. Adult only households accounted for 78.8% of the homeless households.



- 12 veterans were identified as homeless, 4 more than in 2016.
- Among homeless adults, 55.1% identified a disabling condition. The predominant conditions identified were substance abuse disorders and mental health issues.
- 37.6% of homeless households reported no source of income and 21.2% of homeless households reported that they did not receive any non-cash benefits.
- 30.1% of the homeless households were homeless for more than one year.
