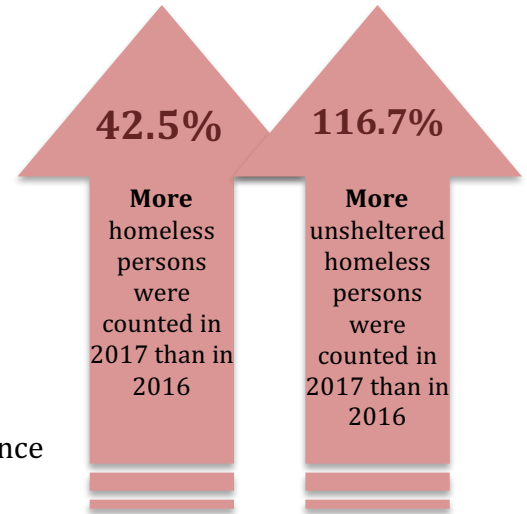


2017 Warren County Point-In-Time Count Fact Sheet

Warren County 2017 Overall Results

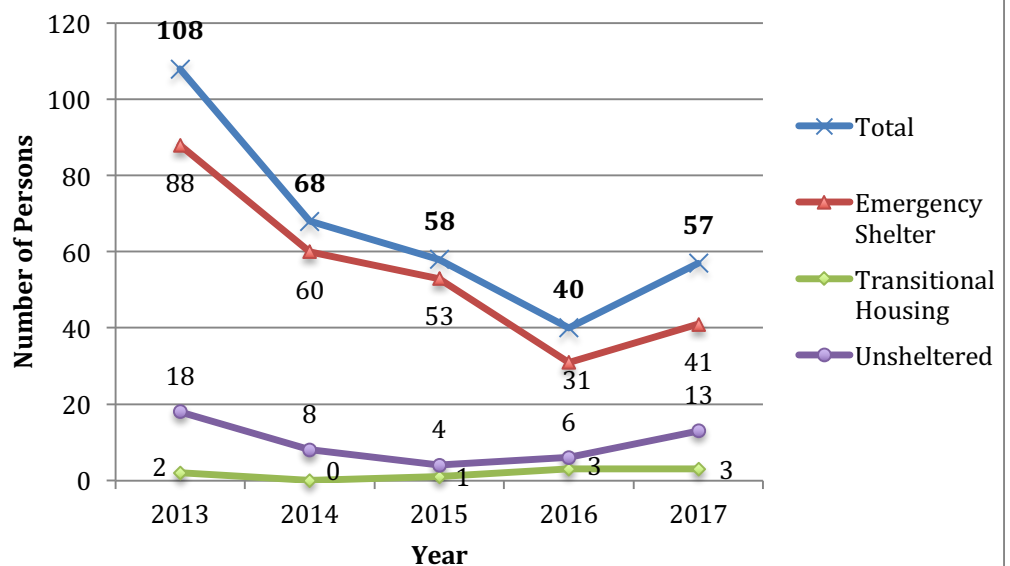
- 57 men, women and children were homeless in Warren County on the night of January 24th, 2017, representing 0.7% of New Jersey's statewide homeless population.
- This represents an increase of 17 persons (42.5%) as compared to the 2016 count.
- 7 persons were identified as chronically homeless, representing 12.3% of the total homeless population.
- 13 persons were unsheltered on the night of the count, a 116.7% increase in the unsheltered homeless population since the count in 2016.



NJ Counts Key Findings

- There was a 32.3% increase in the number of homeless households in emergency shelter, no change in the transitional housing population, and a 116.7% increase in unsheltered households.
- 7 of the 39 homeless households (17.9%) were families with children under the age of 18. There were 13 children under 18 (22.8%) who were homeless on the night of the count. Adult only households accounted for 82.1% of the homeless households.
- 2 veterans were identified as homeless an increase from the 1 veteran counted in 2016.
- Among homeless adults, 61.4% identified a disabling condition. The predominant condition identified was mental health issues.
- 15.4% of homeless households reported no source of income and 7.7% of homeless households reported that they did not receive any non-cash benefits.
- 6 of the homeless households were homeless for more than one year.
